
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

A grassroots project that's making a significant impact by feeding students, families in the community. Through their fellow partnership with *Guzakuza*, founder Queen Sheba has joined the Cohort 2024 Ignite -African Women in Agribusiness fellowship program aimed at strengthening their farming initiative. The fellowship provides participants with the necessary education and training to enhance their agricultural practices. This investment in human capital will not only improve the sustainability of the farms but also ensure a consistent supply of fresh, nutritious food for the students they serve.

#### 3.2 Growth Story



#### 10000

Young Women work for "Micro Finance our way"

- The micro-loans empower women in rural Senegal to start businesses, improving their financial independence.
- Education and business training are offered to recipients, focusing on sustainable village-based businesses.
- To date, 25 women have successfully launched businesses, with 10 employing others in their communities.
- The program builds confidence in women, inspiring them to expand their ventures and lead within their communities.



Education in Online Arabic curriculum courses

- The "Fill the Backpack" program continues to support underprivileged children by distributing essential school supplies.
- An educational initiative for Arabic and Quran studies, in partnership with Awladna Academy, is planned for youth, children, and adults in 2024.
- The project aims to empower Black American and African youth through education, helping them overcome poverty.
- Fundraising efforts focus on supporting these educational causes and providing materials for disadvantaged students.



#### 2100

Health and Hygiene events

- The program distributes hygiene and health kits to women and children in rural Senegal, containing essentials like soap, sanitizers, and basic medicines.
- It educates women on maintaining healthy lifestyles and preventing diseases, benefiting both themselves and their children.
- The program helps reduce child mortality by addressing common illnesses through workshops and education.
- Over 1,400 women have benefited, and the program tracks its success by monitoring participants' health and child mortality rates.




Traditional Economics for Agriculture farms

- The agriculture project in Mboro promotes food security by supporting farms that provide essential nourishment to vulnerable communities.
- Women are empowered through microloans that help them start small businesses, creating sustainable income opportunities.
- The organization offers educational workshops on health and economic practices, with an emphasis on preventing diseases and promoting wellness.
- Clean water access initiatives distribute water packs to areas in need, crucial for sustaining life in rural regions.

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

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#### **5.1 Upcoming projects**

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#### 1. The Queen Sheba Village Women and Girl Social Education Centre



The Queen Sheba Village Women and Girl Social Education Centre is a groundbreaking project currently under construction. This innovative initiative aims to provide a safe and supportive space for women and girls in the community to access quality education, vocational training, and health services.

#### 2. Queen Sheba Farm Food Initiative



Queen Sheba Village partners with Thioune Farming (MBORO) and contributes to the advocacy of Sustainable Development Goal (SDG2) which aims to end hunger, improve nutrition and promote sustainable agriculture. To expand her agriculture-based lunch program, Queen Sheba Village is now expanding collaborations with her team of local farmers to grow and source food directly closer to the founder's Village.

- 1. Queen Sheba 's strategy to facilitate training for youth on sustaining farming techniques to increase their understanding and knowledge to learn techniques to increase yield, quality ensuring a steady food supply at Queen Sheba Village local kitchen. A Farming Co-ops is born!
- 2. Incorporate School Gardens will include:
  - a. **Education and Engagement:** Establish gardens within schools where students can learn to grow vegetables and fruits. This would not only provide fresh produce but also instil agricultural knowledge in the community.
  - b. **Resource Sharing:** Set up a resource-sharing program where schools can exchange seeds, tools, and knowledge with neighbouring schools.
  - c. Invest in Infrastructure and Storage Solutions: Implement cold storage facilities to reduce food waste and ensure a year-round supply, particularly for perishable produce.
  - d. **Transportation Improvements:** Invest in transport options that can help bring farm produce to the schools quickly and efficiently, even in remote areas.

This and more are the hopeful promising start of the future for the betterment of Feeding humanity in the training educational workshops at Queen Sheba Village organization.
