
"Legacy in Action: The Volunteer Spirit of Queen Sheba Village"

QSV's operations are focused on communities in rural Senegal, and sister associations in Ghana, Nigeria. QSV supports teens in Washington DMV regions. QSV highlights volunteerism in its own right and celebrates the dedicated volunteers united at the core aiding humanity.





Challenges faced by the African Communities

Educational Barrier

In Senegal, only 33% of girls enroll in secondary school

Key contributing factors include financial hardships, cultural practices like early marriage and early/ teenage pregnancies . In Kolda region 68% girls marry before the age of 18, i,e double the national average of 31%

Period Poverty

Ghana's females struggle to afford sanitary pads

Locally sourced pads are not effective and imported pads comes with 32.5% luxury tax. Even the Ghana's WPL players not able to afford the quality sanitary products. Health and Hygiene are a big challenge in africa regions

FGC and Others

~ 15% of Nigerian girls affected teenage pregnancy

Teenage pregnancy poses the risks such as maternal health complications, loss of educational opportunities, inadequate access to health services and increased poverty cycles. In rural areas % rate is even high

Lack of mentorship leading to degrowth and unemployment

Africa regions are facing massive school dropout rates, high unemployment (~63%), gender disparities, skill gap in emerging sectors, mental health and social issues due to lack of Teen mentorship and guidance

1000 Women impacted through

Women and girls empowerment education center, which provides Micro Credit program training to assist women in the development of sustainable, village-based businesses that support their families







3050 learners benefited through Fill the backpack program, a educational resource donations like pencils, pens, notebooks, paper, backpacks, computers. Team organizes an event to distribute the school supplies free of charge to individuals and schools

2100 people impacted through

Health & Hygiene Program, where women are exposed to information regarding prevention of spread of illnesses, maintaining healthy lifestyle, and children health. An active team of 20 women, creating the awareness in Ghana villages





5800 starved benefited through Agriculture Farming(AF) project. This project nourishes and feeds children, orphans and the recipients of the village attached to causes QSV passionate about. This farm also

generated the employment to the local youth

We successfully launched this initial project in 2013 in Diourbel (Touba) Senegal. QSV has served other villages and continues the upward momentum putting smiles on little ones faces. Annual Project cost: \$5000

QSV's Health & Hygiene Program



Abandonment of Female Genital Cutting (FGC)

FGC is a procedure that intentionally alters the female genital organ for non-medical reasons in order to control a woman's "chastity." This harmful practice is carried out from infancy and on very young girls. QSV is spreading awareness to end FGC. Annual Project Cost: \$ 1500

Young Women & Girls Education Empowerment Social Center in Mbour

The Social Education Center that enables young women and girls to have access to education in one conducive location feasible to a significant population of citizens. Est. cost: \$ 100,000
